BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The primary goal for Coordinated Entry is to allocate assistance effectively and as equitably as possible no matter where or how people present. A requirement of HUD, agency participation in Coordinated Entry will work with other local organizations to:

- Implement a standardized process for assessing consumer need, eligibility, and priority for various services and programs;
- Produce more informed referrals based on bed availability and ability of a particular program or resource to meet a consumer’s needs;
- Prioritize the most vulnerable households in the community for receipt of assistance;
- Improve the speed with which people are connected with resources or programs that best fit their needs; and
- Capture data about who is entering the system and their activity once they are in the system.

The ROCC Coordinated Entry System operates in 26 counties that represent the ROCC’s rural regions. Community Action Agencies (CAA) in the regions lead the coordinated entry process in their geographical location.
